What if you miss the deadline to pay and file? You will be charged interest on your unpaid taxes. The interest rate for late payment of taxes is currently 7%. There is also a late-filing penalty of 5% of your balance owing, and you add another 1% for each full month you're late, to a maximum of 12 months. Those amounts are doubled to 10% and 2%, respectively, if you failed to file and pay on time
